### **CAMPUS UPDATE**

After more than 5 years of planning an expansion to respond to growing need, the dream is reality! On Wednesday, October 19, over 230 guests gathered for the Grand Opening of the new DOORWAYS Jefferson Avenue Campus.

### **HOUSING PROGRAMS**

DOORWAYS offers six housing programs that range from assistive living to emergency housing, permanent housing, and subsidies to prevent homelessness.

Cooper House - Offering 24/7 assistance for those unable to live independently.

Comprehensive Flexible Housing/Emergency Housing - For those in housing crisis, we offer 30/60 day emergency housing as well as comprehensive flexible housing.

Jumpstart - Often single-parent households, Jumpstart houses families in housing crisis with young children, jumping them from homelessness to permanent housing.

Residential - Seven housing complexes with 103 apartments including one-bedroom units for individuals and four-bedrooms units for families with children.

Metro Own Home Subsidies - For clients in their own accommodations in the St. Louis Metro area experiencing difficulty paying rents/utilities, DOORWAYS provides temporary financial assistance while the client stabilizes.

Outstate Subsidies - Provides rent/utility subsidies as well as limited emergency housing in rural parts of Missouri and Illinois.

### **EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMS**

To strengthen self-sufficiency, we offer individualized care coordination, behavioral health counseling, employment assistance, self-development programming, community activities, and access to resources.

- Behavioral Health Counseling
- Employment Services
- Self-Development Programming
- Community Events
- Access To Resources



With private and community partnership, this first-of-its-kind model will increase capacity and remove barriers to stabilization and recovery.



“Elliott Place” launched with a \$2M award from HUD to construct 39 housing units for HIV+ clients with severe mental illness and substance-use conditions. Ground breaking is scheduled for Spring 2023.
